

Designing a Roadmap to Scale Impact and Reach More Youth Across Canada

Take a Hike (TaH)

Every day, vulnerable youth across Canada face overwhelming challenges—mental health struggles, unstable home environments, and barriers to education. For many, traditional classroom settings don't provide the support they need to thrive.

Take a Hike offers a different path forward. By embedding full-time mental health and emotional well-being programs into alternate education classrooms, they create a space where youth can heal, learn, and grow, supported by counselling and the transformative power of outdoor experiential learning.

After years of success in British Columbia, Take a Hike set an ambitious goal: expand to 25 programs, serve 500 youth annually, and reach new regions across Canada by 2028. To support this growth, Take a Hike partnered with Capitalize for Kids to co-develop a four-year operational roadmap aligned with their strategic vision. Through collaboration with leadership and front-line staff, we delivered 26 tailored recommendations focused on building a strong foundation for expansion. Recommendations were centered around key themes including developing a robust workforce strategy, evolving the support structure for program staff, preparing the workforce for change, increasing their profile and driving revenue growth, and centralizing key operational functions.

The resulting roadmap doesn't just outline what needs to happen—it provides a clear, actionable plan to guide Take a Hike through its next chapter. With the right people, processes, and tools in place, the organization is well-equipped to scale its impact—reaching more youth, in more communities, with the life-changing support they deserve.



The Problem

For youth facing significant mental health challenges, the right support at the right time can be life-changing—but too often, services are fragmented or inaccessible. Without integrated, school-based support, they risk disengagement and long-term setbacks. Take a Hike fills this gap by combining mental health care with alternative education. As demand grows, a clear operational roadmap is key to scaling this impact sustainably—reaching more youth while maintaining the quality that makes the program effective.



The Solution

We partnered with Take a Hike's leadership and frontline staff to co-develop a four-year operational roadmap designed to support the organization's national expansion. The roadmap includes tailored recommendations focused on strengthening implementing operations—from management system to building shared services for finance, IT, and HR. In parallel, we developed tools and processes to support change management, workforce planning, and long-term sustainability, ensuring Take a Hike can scale its impact while maintaining the quality of care that defines its program.
